Introduction

Baku Slavic University aligns its academic strategy with the United Nations 2030 Agenda, with a strong institutional commitment to SDG 4 Quality Education. The University recognizes education as a transformative driver of social development and promotes a learning environment based on equal access, inclusivity, multicultural understanding and lifelong learning.

As part of its SDG 4 commitments, BSU ensures free access to educational resources for individuals who are not formally enrolled at the University. These include open access to computer laboratories, library and reading rooms, conference collections, public lectures and community-based training programmes, guaranteeing that educational opportunities remain accessible to the wider society.

BSU's approach is grounded in the principles of equity, non-discrimination and universal participation, ensuring that all community members—regardless of gender, ethnicity, disability, socioeconomic background, or immigration status—have equal access to learning opportunities. The University integrates sustainable education principles across its teaching, research and outreach activities, preparing graduates who are ethical, socially responsible and capable of contributing to national and global progress.



Mission and Strategic Framework

The mission of Baku Slavic University is to prepare highly qualified professionals who combine academic competence with social awareness, ethical responsibility and global citizenship. The University promotes values that support human development, social well-being, cultural understanding, peace and mutual respect, reflecting its long-standing commitment to inclusive and transformative education.

In line with this mission, the BSU Higher Education Center plays a key role in strengthening academic quality and modernizing institutional development. The Center's core functions include:

- advancing research capacity and promoting the internationalization of scientific activities;
 - integrating research outcomes into teaching processes and labour-market needs;
 - supporting high-quality academic publications and postgraduate research in reputable journals;
 - ensuring that master's and doctoral programmes meet international and Bologna Process standards;
 - organizing national and international academic events for young researchers;
 - providing professional development programmes for academic and administrative staff.



Inclusive Access and Equity in Education

Ensuring access to education for all members of society is one of BSU's primary institutional priorities. The University has established comprehensive anti-discrimination and equal opportunity policies that safeguard students, staff and external participants from bias based on gender, disability, ethnicity, religion, immigration status, or socioeconomic background. These principles form the foundation of an inclusive and equitable learning environment.

BSU pays special attention to vulnerable and underrepresented groups by providing targeted scholarships, tuition fee reductions, academic mentorship and tailored support services. The University has also implemented significant accessibility improvements across campus facilities, creating an enabling environment for students with special educational needs.





Inclusive Access and Equity in Education

As part of its equity-driven commitment, BSU extends educational opportunities to individuals beyond its student population by offering:

- Free computer lab access during designated hours
- Free access to the BSU Library, reading rooms and reference materials
- Free participation in open lectures, academic seminars and public events
- Free community training programmes for teachers, youth, parents, and civil society groups

BSU also prioritizes gender equality, actively promoting women's participation in academic, administrative and leadership roles. The University reinforces inclusivity by integrating Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) principles into all academic programmes, empowering learners to develop lifelong learning habits, responsible citizenship and sustainability-oriented thinking.

Furthermore, BSU regularly hosts public educational and cultural events that are fully open to the general community, including public lectures on linguistics, education, multilingualism, intercultural communication, and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), as well as practical workshops such as teacher training sessions, digital literacy programmes, inclusive education seminars and youth development initiatives. Cultural activities—poetry evenings, book presentations, language festivals and theatre performances—are likewise accessible to all members of society.

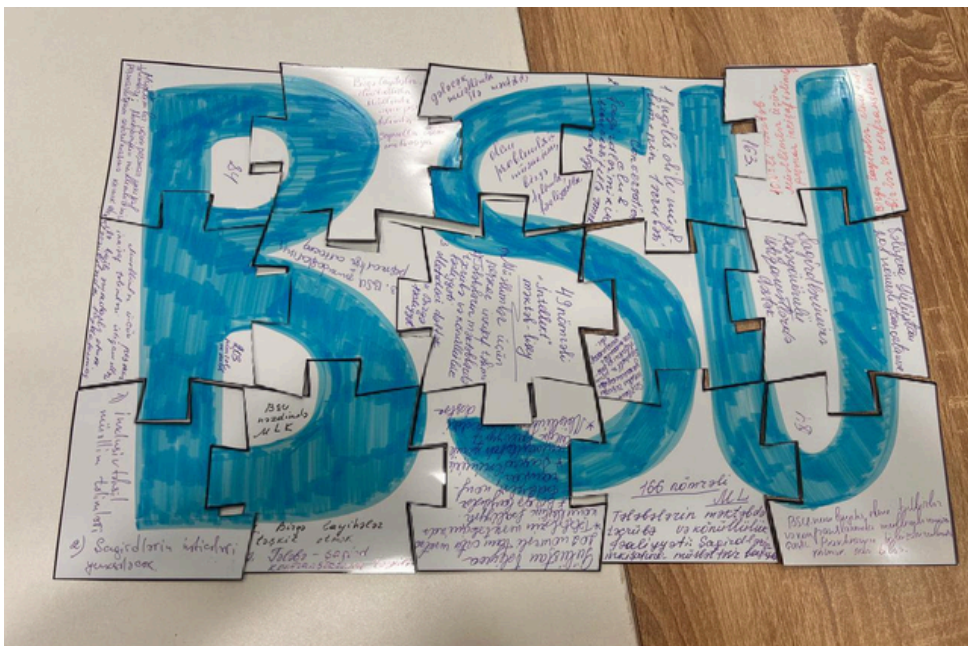


Department of Inclusive and Adaptive Education

The Department of Inclusive and Adaptive Education was established by the decision of the Academic Council of Baku Slavic University. The creation of the department aims to support the process of building an inclusive society, to develop the scientific and methodological foundations of pedagogical approaches that consider the diversity of learners and to strengthen specialist training in this field.

Currently, the department's academic staff consists of 7 members, 2 of whom hold academic degrees. The department includes 2 psychologists, 3 pedagogues, 1 philologist and 1 methodologist. This composition allows for the implementation of an interdisciplinary approach covering various aspects of education collaboratively.

The examination process for students with disabilities is conducted separately a mentor and an assistant teacher participate in the exam.





Main areas of activity of the department:

- Conducting scientific research in the field of inclusive and adaptive education: Investigating approaches that ensure diversity and equity in the education system, adapting teaching methods for inclusivity and developing new pedagogical models.
- Training specialists for higher and secondary special education levels: Designing educational programs on inclusive and adaptive education, updating course curricula and preparing qualified specialists in this field.
- Promoting inclusive and psycho-pedagogical approaches in the teaching and upbringing process: Enhancing skills for working with children with special educational needs and raising awareness among teachers and parents.
- Participation in international cooperation and projects: Learning from international experiences in inclusive education, implementing joint projects with partner universities and joining international networks.
- Organizing seminars, training sessions and public awareness events: Organizing conferences, roundtable discussions and methodological seminars to share academic and practical knowledge.
- Establishing strategic partnerships with government and non-governmental organizations;
- Organizing field trainings to strengthen inclusive education skills in the regions.

Teaching, Learning, and Quality Assurance

The internal quality assurance system of BSU plays a pivotal role in safeguarding academic integrity and promoting continuous improvement across all areas of teaching and learning. Operating in alignment with ISO 9001:2015 and ISO 21001:2018 standards, this system encompasses curriculum development, faculty performance, student assessment and administrative processes. The University maintains an institutional Quality Assurance Policy that outlines its commitments to transparency, accountability and continuous enhancement of academic standards.

All academic programmes undergo regular review to ensure their relevance labour market needs and emerging educational trends, conducted consultation with faculty, students, alumni and external stakeholders.

BSU prioritizes modern pedagogical approaches, including interactive learning, blended education and project-based instruction, all of which strengthen student engagement, creativity and practical skills essential for future employability. Academic staff benefit from continuous professional development opportunities such as training programmes, workshops and international exchange initiatives that support both teaching excellence and research capacity.

BSU's assessment framework integrates formative and summative evaluation, combining examinations, research projects, practical assignments and performance-based assessments.



The Center for Digitalization and Quality Assurance

The Center for Digitalization and Quality Assurance (CDQA) serves as the institutional engine for academic quality and governance. Its work focuses on two core functions: quality enhancement, which includes training, methodological support and the digital transformation of teaching processes; and accountability, which covers performance monitoring, accreditation procedures and internal audits.

The CDQA team conducts regular institutional self-assessments, coordinates external accreditation processes, and ensures compliance with national and international standards. It also prepares annual analytical reports and systematically collects feedback from students, faculty, alumni and employers to identify improvement areas and support transparent decision-making.

The Center promotes digitalization as a key driver of educational quality by implementing online platforms for curriculum management, e-learning and research data exchange. Through these initiatives, BSU has strengthened its academic governance framework and contributed to the modernization of higher education practices in Azerbaijan.

Research, Innovation, and Knowledge Transfer

BSU views research as a core component of its academic mission and an essential driver of educational quality. The University's research agenda covers linguistics, pedagogy, psychology, inclusive education and the humanities, reflecting its multidisciplinary orientation.

Faculty members and students are encouraged to participate in joint research projects, publish in Scopus and Web of Science-indexed journals and present their work at international conferences. BSU also promotes undergraduate research, fostering early scientific thinking and preparing students for advanced academic study.

The University's Library Learning Center plays a central role in supporting this research culture by providing robust academic resources and access to international research databases. Through its digital infrastructure and comprehensive information services, the Library functions as the main hub for research, academic development and knowledge dissemination across all faculties.

To enhance research excellence and reinforce a culture of high-quality scholarship, Baku Slavic University implements an annual incentive scheme that rewards academic staff for publications indexed in leading international databases, including Scopus, Web of Science and Google Scholar. At the end of each academic year, faculty members who demonstrate outstanding research performance receive financial awards and formal recognition. This initiative strengthens the university's research capacity, promotes global visibility and supports continuous improvement aligned with international quality standards.

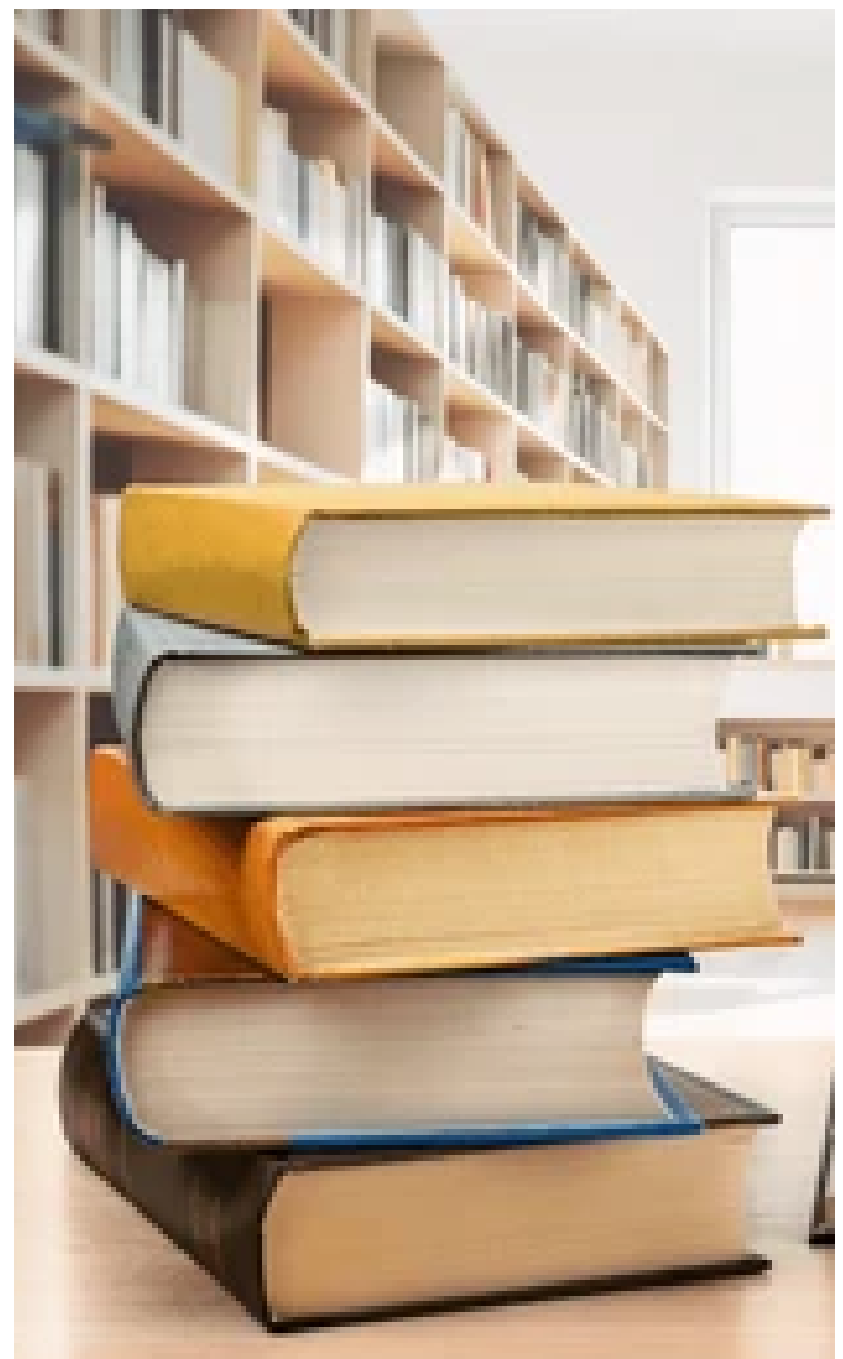
Founded in 1955, the university's "Scientific Works" journal—one of the country's longstanding academic periodicals with a 70-year publishing legacy—continues to be issued annually, supporting the advancement of research culture, academic dissemination and international scholarly engagement.





Research, Innovation, and Knowledge Transfer

The Library Learning Center at Baku Slavic University serves as a key academic and information hub that supports teaching, research and innovation across all faculties. The Center houses a comprehensive collection of over 350,000 volumes, including scientific literature, textbooks, fiction and foreign-language resources, and welcomes around 135,000 visitors annually. With over 5,000 registered users and 250 reading-room seats, the Library ensures equitable access to knowledge and lifelong learning opportunities. It provides institutional access to Web of Science, Scopus and ProQuest, offering essential research support and bibliographic training for students and faculty.



Current priorities include the development of a digital library, integration with international databases and the promotion of Open Science initiatives.



Community Engagement and Volunteerism

BSU's engagement with the community is one of its strongest instruments for achieving social impact through education. The BSU Volunteers. The organization currently unites more than 500 active students.

Through volunteer work, students participate in awareness campaigns, educational mentorship programs in public schools and events promoting inclusivity and environmental responsibility. These activities cultivate leadership, empathy and social awareness, helping students to connect their academic knowledge with real-life community needs.

The University also collaborates with governmental and non-governmental organizations to implement projects related to literacy promotion, youth development and intercultural education.
